Wow half a year is nearly gone already! Even though winter is here the vegetable patch remains a little hive of activity with tamariki excited to spend their lunchtimes in the garden munching whatever the garden has to offer (not much at this time of year, but some carrots are being eaten).

A lot has happened in our lovely garden so far this year! Mr Vogel has installed an awesome garden shed to keep our supplies safe from the weather and free up the glass house just for plants! The lovely people from Don Mclean flooring donated enough old woollen carpet for us to cover all the garden paths, which have now been fully barked (thank you Mr Vogel and Mr Cassidy) The garden is looking amazing and no more weeding the

pathways!! The old bathtubs are filled with soil and compost ready for planting, the worm farms have been re-established and we look forward to using the worm castings to feed our glasshouse crops this spring.

The Tamariki have harvested the crop of popcorn and are patiently waiting for it to dry out enough to pop - we will try popping it in the next couple of weeks.

Over the summer we let our crops go to seed and the tamariki collected many different seeds - carrots, spinach, broccoli, salad mix, sweet 100 tomatoes, capsicum! These seeds are now available to purchase from the school office for \$2 a pack, a great way to support our garden efforts if you have a garden at home.

For those that don't know, the garden is located behind the school pool, beside the lunch kitchen and is open Mon/Wed/Thur. It is there for the whole community to be part of, so feel free to come and get your hands dirty.
