

Grantlea Downs School Out of Zone Enrolments 2020

The Board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their child at Grantlea Downs for 2020.

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

The Board has determined that 25 New Entrant places and 10 Year 2 places are likely to be available for out of zone students next year. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

Next year there will be two enrolment periods. The first enrolment period runs 3 February 2020 to 3 July 2020. The second period runs from 20 July 2020 to 15 December 2020.

For students seeking enrolment within the first enrolment period, the deadline for receipt of applications for out of zone places is **Tuesday 15 October 2019**. If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places, a ballot will be held on Tuesday 22 October 2019.

Parents of students who live in the home zone and intend enrolling their child at any time during the next year should notify the school by Tuesday 15 October 2019 to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.


