Upcoming Union Meetings - IMPORTANT

Our teachers and staff are truly dedicated to their work, but the limited funding for schools affects their ability to fully support every student. To tackle this issue, members of the NZEI Te Riu Roa, including primary teachers, teacher aides, and principals, are advocating for increased investment in our children. We're striving to improve conditions for teachers, support staff, and students alike.

Keeping talented teachers, teacher aides, and staff is vital, as they are the heart of our school and make a big impact. As part of this effort, our teachers will attend a paid union meeting on **Wednesday**, **20th August**. **Grantlea Downs will remain open, but we strongly encourage those who can, to pick up their children from 1:45 p.m.** Legally, I must allow every NZEI member to attend these meetings. This means the school will stay open, but only six staff will be available to supervise students throughout the afternoon.

We would greatly appreciate it if you could arrange to collect your child from **1:45 p.m. on Wednesday, 20th August.** For those who cannot be picked up, teachers will continue to support them with an afternoon program. More details about where to collect your child from will be posted on HERO by your child's teacher. Students can not walk home unsupervised before 3pm.

I want to emphasise how important your support is. Our main goal is to fight for better conditions for teachers, making it an attractive profession, and most importantly, to secure better support for our children. Supporting our children's learning also helps our families and communities thrive. Your support is crucial in building the case for better investment in our children. Thank you for standing with us.

Attendance

One of the things we are continuing to focus on in 2025 is student attendance. You will hear us talking about this with you and with our students.

If a student misses one day of school every two weeks, they miss more than a whole year of school by 16 years of age. As a parent or caregiver, you, alongside our school, play a key role in building strong habits of regular school attendance.

All students are legally required to attend school every day, and it is a shared responsibility to make sure students attend and engage in learning from when they first start school.

You must let the school know if your child is going to be absent or intends to be absent for a portion of the school term for whatever reason, like a tangi or medical procedure. Family holidays or taking time off for extracurricular activities (not organised by school) are not acceptable reasons for being absent.

Knowing if your child is well enough to go to school can be tricky. Health guidance to support you in deciding is available here.

If you are still unsure, get in touch with us and let's work together to support your learner.

If you're struggling at home with getting your child to school, talk to us and we can engage with our attendance advisors or school health nurse for support.

Our school is committed to supporting your child to attend school.

Our school continues to build a culture that fosters attendance every day by having:

- School staff who have strong relationships with students and family.
- A school culture that recognises your child and your family for who you are, where you come from and what you value.
- A school whānau that takes all practical steps to make sure your child is at school and progressing in their learning.
- A school that is safe and welcoming for everyone in our school community.

If you have any attendance queries and issues, please contact us so we can work together.

maths problem.
Then a runner from each team would run around all the desks in their row to bring a new question back to the group.
The faster the students solved the problem, the more the runner had to



rush off. It was a hot hall. Once the runner took the answer to the judges table, they would be told whether or not the question was correct. If it was, they would get a new question, otherwise they would have to return to solve the problem.

The teams were all very close. We had teams from Ashburton, Hinds, Waimate and Oamaru there as well as our local schools. Grantlea Downs students stood out in the red uniforms, so the parents and I could see how they were going.



It was a privilege to watch our school's teams; two year 8 teams and 1 year 7 team. They did not give up on any hard question, and they stayed very focussed throughout the

competition. All of the teams worked so well together and were very supportive of each other. All three groups worked collaboratively thus making their event a success. Well done to you all.


Dear Resident,


