

WHAT IS S.T.E.A.M.

S.T.E.A.M. is an approach to learning that involves Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Maths. Students are presented with a problem or challenge where they use the engineering process to create a solution. Students learn needed knowledge in S.T.E.A.M to be able to help them reach and test their solution.

Through S.T.E.A.M. students learn important skills such as problem solving, creating, teamwork, communication, and innovation.

WHAT WE NEED

To conduct STEAM challenges a steady supply of recycled materials is needed.

Recycled materials need to be clean and easy for children to use (thick cardboard is too hard to cut etc). Type of materials that would be appreciated: Newspaper, cardboard tubes, wool, shoeboxes, food

METRO SCHOOL BUS SERVICE - T3 ROUTE TRIAL

Due to the Metro School Bus trial, we ask that parents **do not park on the bus stop** and keep it clear for the bus to drop off and pick students up, before and after school.

The Metro School Bus Service is trialling extending the T3 route to include Grantlea Downs School. The trial started 21 August and runs until the end of Term 3. The trial enables children to catch the bus from any bus stop along the T3 route in the mornings and then be picked up from School in the afternoon (around 3.15pm) and follow the route back. For more information including maps and times, please see the post on the Community Notices tab on HERO 21 August. If there is enough demand, this service will become permanent.

Thanks to the introduction of the Government's 'Under 13 Free' concession, Timaru children can hop on board the Metro School buses for free (this does not include the MyWay Service). Each child will need their own Metrocard to travel for free and present it to the ticket machine each time they ride. The Metrocard can be purchased from the information Centre at a one off cost of \$5.00.
