### Dear Parents/Caregivers

You are invited to the Annual Grantlea Downs Athletics Sports for students <u>Acacia and Kereta Syndicate</u>. The sports will be held at school, on Tuesday 19th November (postponement date: Thursday 21st November).

### Information about the "Standards Events"

The "Standards Athletics Sports" that your child will be competing in is designed to have each child compete against prearranged standards, but it also accommodates those who excel and are more competitive. In standards events students are competing to a standard rather than just against other students. Each child will score 1, 2 or 3 for every event. All those achieving a 3 will then compete for a 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> placing.

The athletics sports is also an Interhouse sports competition with a shield up for grabs. The winning house will be decided by all the students' individual points being added together. The students are encouraged to dress in the colour of their house as this promotes house spirit and competition.

Your child will need the following:

- ✓ Students are required to <u>wear shorts</u>, not track pants.
- ✓ All students must wear both <u>sunscreen and a sunhat</u>.
- ✓ They will need a **drink bottle** to ensure they drink plenty of water throughout the day.
- ✓ Students will need warm clothing for between events or if the weather changes.

# Please find below a note from the Timaru District Council

Old North Road - Road reconstruction

From 11th November 2019 for approximately 4 weeks we will be reconstructing the road surface on Old North

This will allow for a smoother drive on Old North Road prior to Christmas 2019!

To reduce delays to traffic and ensure a quicker and safer construction period, we would like to ask road users to consider alternative routes. The Road will be open to uphill traffic only. One suggested alternative Route is

Please follow all road workers instructions and signage and please ensure speeds through the worksite and on detours are kept low to keep all road users safe.

Footpaths will be open. Please bear in mind that there will be large construction equipment working so children and parents will need to be mindful of the dangers that this poses.

Any students that ride a bike to school and would normally use Old North Road are advised to dismount and walk
