

How about becoming a trustee and using your skills and experiences to help shape a positive future for our children?

What is a school board of trustees?

Every state and state-integrated school in New Zealand has a board of trustees. Boards bring families, communities and schools together to work for a quality education for our children.

The board of trustees is a Crown entity. It is the employer of all school staff and sets the school's overall strategic direction. The school's principal is the board's 'chief executive' and manages the school operations in line with the board's policies.

Who can become a trustee?

The membership of the school board includes elected parent representatives, an elected staff representative and the principal.

What do trustees do?

School trustees have a very important role in making sure every child at the school can reach their highest possible standard in educational achievement. If you want to know more about what trustees do,

Here are some of the things they do:

- Work with the principal and consult with staff, students and the community
- Set the educational goals and strategic direction of the school
- Monitor progress and inform parents on how the school is progressing against its annual targets and on the development
 of the students
- Decide how the school's funding will be spent
- Select the school's principal and support the development of all staff
- Ensure the school is a physically and emotionally safe place for all students and staff, and is inclusive of and caters for students with differing needs
- Oversee the management of staff, property, finances, curriculum and administration.

How do I become a trustee?

Ask your school about going along to a board meeting to see how it works. The board chair or any other board member can also answer questions about what the board does. Contact your school if you want to find out about standing for election, nominating someone else or voting in the election - they will be happy to help.

Sharing Images of Students

Grantlea Downs School follows guidelines to protect students' privacy and safety at school when we **publish student information**. This includes sharing **photo**s of our students. We encourage parents to also consider privacy issues when sharing **photo**s and videos taken at school events.

We are happy for parents to take **photo**s/videos of their children at sports day, cultural day, or other public school events. If copyright issues apply, such as at a school play, which forbid **photo**s or videos to be taken, the school makes this known.

If parents want to share photos/videos on social media, they should consider the following:

- Show the images to your children and discuss them before posting them on social media. This will help your children understand that they should always think about what goes out to the public on the internet.
- · If the images have pictures of other students, think about editing to remove them.
- Make sure that other students are not named in any online posts.

Parents should remember that posting **photo**s of other people can amount to harassment and they should take care to ensure **photo**s are fair to other people. This ensures everyone can enjoy school events without worrying what will end up on social media.
