Dear Parents/Caregivers

You are invited to the Annual Grantlea Downs Athletics Sports for students **Years 4-8.** The sports will be held at school, on Tuesday 7th November (postponement date: Thursday 9th November).

Information about the "Standards Events"

The "Standards Athletics Sports" that your child will be competing in is designed to have each child compete against prearranged standards, but it also accommodates those who excel and are more competitive. In standards events students are competing to a standard rather than just against other students. Each child will score 1, 2 or 3 for every event. All those achieving a 3 will then compete for a 1st, 2nd or 3rd placing.

The athletics sports is also an Interhouse sports competition with a shield up for grabs. The winning house will be decided by all the students' individual points being added together. The students are encouraged to dress in the colour of their house as this promotes house spirit and competition.

Your child will need the following:

- Students are required to <u>wear shorts</u>, not track pants.
- All students must wear both **sunscreen and a sunhat**.
- They will need a **drink bottle** to ensure they drink plenty of water throughout the day.
- Students will need warm clothing for between events or if the weather changes.

POOL UPDATE

During the Term 3 holidays, a crew from Industrial Fibreglass Solutions worked very hard to grind off sixty years of rubberized paint in our school pool before applying a new fibreglass lining that we hope will last another sixty years. Earlier, the Pool & Leisure Centre team replaced old piping, skimmer boxes and filter systems that will make the pool easier to manage. Before the water is put in, the pool edge will be painted and the handlebars/ladder will be returned in readiness for the summer swimming season. We are very grateful that funding for the school pool upgrade has come from a NZ Community Trust grant, the Home & School Program and through the Board of Trustees.





TREE PLANTING

Last Wednesday, a selected group of keen Acacia and Kereta students joined the Arowhenua Native Nursery team to plant more than 120 native seedlings of flax, juncus, tussock grass, muehlenbeckia, ribbonwood and cabbage tree along the previously prepared section of Te Ahi Tarakihi Creek behind the school. The students learned the best method of planting seedlings and then also installed tree guards to protect them until they get more established. Once the plants get bigger, it will improve the overall health of the creek by reducing weed and algae growth, preventing erosion, providing shelter for native wildlife and slowing damaging floodwaters downstream. We hope to gradually tackle other sections of the creek banks in years to come.

Thanks again to the students who did a magnificent job, and the Arowhenua Native Nursery team who donated their time, hard work and expertise to our Enviroschool project. We hope to get funding for the native plants and guards from local businesses.


