Grantlea Downs School

Out of Zone Enrolments 2026

The Board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their child at Grantlea Downs for 2026.

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

The Board has determined that 29 places are likely to be available over the Yr0, Yr1, Yr7, Yr8, classes, for out of zone students next year. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

Next year there will be two enrolment periods. The first enrolment period runs from 4 February 2026 to 3rd July 2026. The second period runs from 20 July 2026 to 16 December 2026.

For students seeking enrolment within the first enrolment period, the deadline for receipt of applications for out of zone places is Wednesday 8th October 2025. If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places, a ballot will be held on Friday 10th October 2025.

Parents of students who live in the home zone and intend enrolling their child at any time during the next year, should notify the school by Tuesday 15 October 2024 to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.



Give your little explorers their first taste of independence with our 1-night camps. Like the rare but mighty PETREL seabird, they'll discover just how capable they really are.


Ages 11-13: ALBATROSS Overnight Camp
