On Friday evening, you will receive your child's mid-year report on HERO.

The mid-year report provides a comprehensive overview of your child's academic progress in Reading, Writing, and Mathematics. It details specific goals for each subject area that your child is currently working towards and highlights their achievements and areas for improvement. The report includes a general comment on your child's attitude towards learning, evaluating how they embody our school values of Excellence, Honesty, Respect, and Responsibility. Additionally, it assesses how they demonstrate key competencies such as managing themselves, participating and contributing, and relating to others. We hope you find the insights in your child's report informative and encouraging. If you have any questions or wish to discuss the report further, please feel free to contact your

classroom teacher to arrange a meeting. Additionally, we have scheduled learning conferences in Week 3 of next term, where you can engage in deeper discussions regarding your child's academic progress and well-being.

Reading Data Update

We are tracking well on the whole, and most students are making progress. 72% of our student population is working at or above the expected level in reading. 26% of our Māori students are working towards their expected level. This is 7% of the school population.

33% of our NZ European/Pakeha students are working towards their expected level. This is 18% of the school population. 37% of boys and 20% of girls are working towards their expected level. This means 63% of boys and 80% of girls are working at or above the expected level.








Good news for Term 3 | Metro double decker on T2 school route starting Monday 21 July

Metro have been monitoring the number of passengers using school bus services and we know that the bus – especially the T2 service – can be quite full.

Current Metro school buses can legally take up to 60 people - this includes standing and seated passengers. New Zealand Transport Authority Waka Kotahi (NZTA) determines the loading limit for every passenger service. This means that if the bus is loaded to capacity, no further students will be able to board.

To allow for more passengers on the T2 route, a double decker will be introduced from Monday, 21 July 2025.

Additional capacity improvements are planned for other Timaru school and Temuka routes under our new contract with Ritchies, though these changes are not expected to take effect until mid-2026.

In the meantime, we recommend families: Discuss backup transport options in case your bus is full. Encourage students to arrive early to secure a spot.


The Community Dental Service will be closed for the upcoming school holidays
