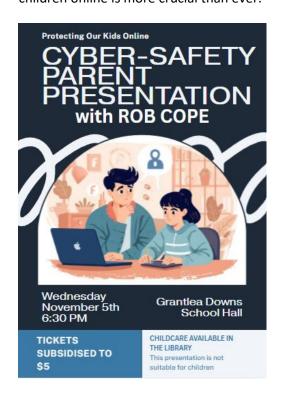

Last week, our Halloween dress-up mufti day was

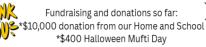
a resounding success! Not only did we have a blast, but we also raised \$400 towards our junior playground upgrade. Thank you for your enthusiastic participation and support.

Steps for Success

At Grantlea Downs we believe that part of preparing our tamariki for success in life is helping them learn responsibility and independence — both at school and at home.

When children help out at home — making their bed, tidying their backpack, organising their school things, washing a dish — they are doing more than just chores. They are building:

- discipline ("I can begin the day well")
- ownership ("This is mine and I can look after it")
- follow-through ("I do what I say I'll do")

Research and practice tell us that children who learn small responsibilities early often grow into young adults who feel confident tackling big tasks. We also know that many households have different routines, time pressures and cultural practices. If your child is not yet doing these things — it doesn't mean they are lazy, nor does it mean you've done something wrong. It's an invitation to start a conversation at home — "What daily routines do we have? What simple responsibility could your child start with this week?"

Here are some ideas to try together:

- Choose one small thing this week (make the bed, pack the bag, clean the lunch box)
- At the end of the week, reflect together: "What went well? What could I try differently next week?"
- As your child becomes consistent, add in one more responsibility.

Let's embrace responsibility as one of our school values — and enjoy learning it together as capable, grounded and confident young people.

Information about the "Standards Events"

The "Standards Athletics Sports" that your child will be competing in is designed to have each child compete against prearranged standards, but it also accommodates those who excel and are more competitive. In standards events, students are competing to a standard rather than just against other students. Each child will score 1, 2, 3 or 4 for every event. All those achieving a 3 will then compete for a 1st, 2nd or 3rd placing. A child who achieves a 4 will be measured against the South Canterbury Standards.

The athletics sports is also an Interhouse sports competition with a shield up for grabs. The winning house will be decided by all the students' individual points being added together.

The students are encouraged to dress in the colour of their house as this promotes house spirit and competition.
