Grantlea Downs Camps - Survey

We are currently reviewing how we run our camps.

Our main reasons for review are concerns around:

- * Cost to families.
- * Changes to health and safety regulations have made camps more difficult and costly to run.
- * Currently classes are split meaning that students are not always with their own teacher.
- * Syndicates with only three teachers don't have enough staff to have two teachers per camp.

Proposals:

1) Retain the status quo.

Camps are run in academic year groups every year.

2) Odd year/Even year options -

Odd years (2019, 2021 etc): Full syndicate camps - Acacia at Woodend, Kereta at Wainui.

Even years (2020, 2022 etc): Syndicates have "E.O.T.C. (Education outside the classroom) Week" taking part in activities around the district - eg. bush walks, rock climbing, kayaking, beach visits, cycling etc.

<u>School Road Safety Reminder - Dropping children off at school</u>

Stop chaos at the school gate

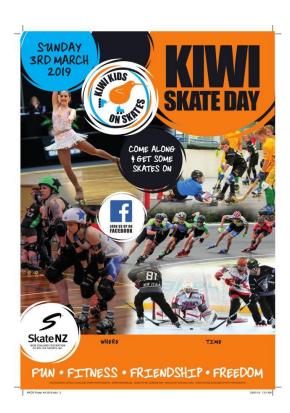
