### SCHOOL DONATIONS 2018

Late last year the Government announced that each school that no longer requested school donations from their school community to help with the financial shortfall to run a school, would gain a financial benefit for doing so. However the government has not, as yet, outlined how schools will be able to access this extra financial benefit at this stage.

The Board have decided to put on 'hold' the request for school donations until government policy has been clarified. However, should the government not provide extra funding this year we will have to request donations from parents/caregivers, the same as in previous years. Unfortunately the school can not provide the extra resources and experiences without the support of school donations or extra government funding. We will keep you updated on this matter.
