This Friday marks Term 1 coming to an end. The children and staff are looking forward to a well-deserved break. Thank you to everybody that has helped with school events this term. We do appreciate your support as we wouldn't be able to run these events without it.

Early in Term 2, we are running a parent cybersafety evening on Monday 6th May. Because of the rapidly changing times our children are growing up in, and the mounting challenges and harms they are facing online, we need to start talking about and tackling this as a community. As such, we have organised Filmmaker, Author and Speaker Rob Cope, producer of the documentary "Our Kids Online" to come and give what promises to be a humorous and eye-opening evening talk. Rob's talk will cover many topics including cyberbullying, social media, gaming and the developing brain, selfies, pornography and online predators. He will also discuss solutions such as installing filters, establishing boundaries, locking smartphones and discuss having difficult conversations with your children. He will also challenge you to reduce your own device usage and reconnect as a family.

The talk will be held in our school hall on Monday 6th May from 7-9pm. We will be providing some food beforehand at 6:30pm.

Timaru Mighty Willows: Family and Educators Session- Wednesday 1st May at Grantlea Downs School 7pm – 9pm

Mighty Willows aims to help parents / caregivers / teachers to develop an understanding of children's responses (also known as behaviour, but we don't focus on that!) from the inside out - we discuss the nervous system and how this plays a role in responses, and explore ways to better understand and respond to underlying needs.

This workshop is a condensed version of the Knowing Your Child module. We will explore the root causes of behaviours and get curious about what uses up the child's (or the adult's!) energy (or spoons) during the day. We will discuss how to co-regulate with children.

You will leave the workshop with 2 documents to begin making changes at home or school:

- "Spoons Profile" outlining what is using your child's energy each day
- "Spoon Savers" document outlining ideas to help regulate your child

GRANTLEA DOWNS SCHOOL OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS TERM 3 & 4 2024

The Board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their child at Grantlea Downs for Term 3 & 4 2024.

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

Applications for out-of-zone places are now being invited for those students who will become eligible for enrolment during the period 22 July to 17 December 2024. We currently have places available in Year 0, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3, Year 5, Year 6 and Year 7. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school zone.

The deadline for receipt of applications for out-of-zone places is **Tuesday 7 May 2024**.

ADVANCED NOTICE OF CHANGES TO THE METRO SCHOOL BUS SERVICE – T3 Route

There will be upcoming changes to concessions, following central government's changes to its Community Connect Concessions Scheme. In Timaru, the free fares for 5–12-year-olds on Metro School and Temuka services, and the MyWay by Metro concession for 19–24-year-olds, will cease on 30 April. This means children travelling on the Metro School Services will need to start paying the 95-cents per ride fare again.

Children aged 5-12-years-old who use Metro services will need to start topping-up their Metro cards again to enable them to pay the child fares.

MyWay's \$1.50 child fare will remain.
