ASTN

From Monday 14 October (the beginning of Term 4), the ASTN (Aoraki School Transport Network) will be providing our students with school transport. Grantlea Downs School will no longer provide our own bus and a driver.

The decision to join the ASTN has been made by the Board of Trustees to ensure the core business of the school is to focus on education. Compliance for schools to run their own buses has become more timeconsuming. Allowing this to be overseen by the ASTN who then contract out to bus companies is a better process. The on-going issues with our own school bus have contributed to this decision.

The ASTN have tendered the run out to bus companies in the area and Ritches Transport have won the tender.

This will mean no changes to parents or the students, other than the bus that will now transport the students will be a Ritchies bus and a Ritchies Bus driver.

Bike/Scooter Track

We are in the process of designing and organising a school bike and scooter track with the support of the Board of Trustees and the Home and School Committee. We are very fortunate that Wayne Dyche from the Board of Trustees has been overseeing this project.

The track has been marked out around the lower field for people to get an idea of what the track will look like.
